Need a Rank Requirement? Well, it's always best to have a Scout Buddy to rise to the top with you!

You can also join the

<u>Merit Badge University on 11/16/24</u>

(8 AM - 4 PM) @ Carbondale Middle School, in Carbondale, CO

This is a great way to start off on merit badges and get multiple in one day! It is best to register earlier rather than later to work on the ones you are interested in the most. The merit badges vary based on the counselors' availability, but there are tons of great ones. (Look for Lee Adams' email from 08/14th with infos & reg. link.) Steps:

- 1. Sign up on our website (<u>https://www.troopwebhost.org/Troop231Vail/</u>).
- 2. Register on the BSA website (<u>https://scoutingcolorado.doubleknot.com/event/three-rivers-merit-badge-university/3058241</u>)
 - 1. Fee: \$5/registrant until October 1st; then \$10/registrant
 - 2. Deadline: registration closes on 11/15/24
- 3. Choose your classes and start earning!

Another great place for earning Merit Badges is <u>The Cell</u> website. Just let your Scoutmaster know that you are ready to work on a badge you are interested in! Check out their website. They keep posting new classes every month or so. <u>https://thecell.org/education/scouting/</u>
