TIP for OUR PARENTS:

Merit Badge Counsellors are not required, but they are important for our Troop.

We want to be able to give the skills and knowledge they need right inside our Troop. Being a M.B. Counsellor helps plan our meetings as well. We outline our meetings by the requirements of the Scouts, so if the majority of Scouts need "First Aid", we plan each meeting to meet that requirement.

Out of all the Eagle Scout required badges, in our Troop we only cover about a quarter of what is required for Eagle, so just imagine what our Scouts could accomplish within our Troop with more M.B. Counsellors on hand! If you have certain skills, or are passionate about a certain subject and would like to share that well of knowledge, please sign up to become a M.B. Counsellor for our Troop - our Scouts will thank you!

Help your Scout reach his goals, while also making our (volunteer) Leaders' lives a bit less hectic!

Our Leaders are happy to help out at any time, based on their availability too, but we've noticed how many Scouts decided to get their requirements as well as the Scoutmaster Conference at the very last minute. Please make sure <u>to have your Scout schedule:</u>

- his sign offs weekly with a Leader he can call <u>any approved Leader</u> and set it up.
- his <u>Scoutmaster Conference</u> at least <u>4 weeks before the next Court of Honor</u> by setting it up with Nate.
- his Board of Review at least 3 weeks before the next Court of Honor by setting it up with Anne.
