TIP for OUR SCOUTS:

Success Reminders: make sure to read the requirement directives in your Scout book and Show, Do, Explain, Demonstrate, while getting your weekly sign offs with your Adult or Patrol Leader (First Class rank or higher).

* It's been demonstrated that in order to learn a new skill one needs to <u>observe</u> (what's around you, or what tickles your interests), <u>research</u> (ask, listen, read & write about it), <u>absorb & experience it</u> (through practicing it with repetition), <u>observe</u> (what happens while doing it), <u>deepen it with exchange</u> (teach others: the Scout's E.D.G.E. Method), and <u>consolidate</u> (also through your weekly sing-offs, so you learn what you do and/or don't <u>yet</u> know as well). These are all good ways to learn, explain, and practice to better absorb and understand yourself, so it's easier to teach your fellow Scouts, and others.

* Ask for your Scoutmaster's approval before you start:

- * a Service Hours / project
- * a Merit Badge
- * a rank required Interview

This way he can better guide you in choosing the right one for your interests, or your new rank / Merit Badge requirements.
