TIPS for OUR PARENTS:

Great Ways to help your Scout & Why it is important to participate in his Scouting path:

- Scouting is a <u>Family program</u> teaching life skills to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.
- Scouting is a <u>Cheerleading task</u> talk with your child about his goals regularly, with a peer to peer discussion. Check in to see how he is doing a couple of times a month (or more often if necessary). Point out positive steps you have seen him taking. Share your own goal setting experiences, and failures too (<u>F.A.I.L</u> = First Attempt In Learning). Ask them questions, learn together, and cheer them on!
- Scouting is a <u>Parental Support program</u> they say a Scout has "4 parents" named Everybody, Somebody, Anybody & Nobody. Help each other in helping your Scout enjoying his chosen path of pursuing and achieving new goals while having fun with his buddies! *P.S.: Sometimes it's easier to ask another parent… we've all been* there

there. 😉
